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### "We've reached an important milestone, but millions remain unprotected..."

- ► For the first time, over half of the global population benefits from social protection.
- Still, just less than half remain without coverage, with the most vulnerable at greatest risk.
- Informal workers, migrants, people with disabilities, and those in crisis settings face systemic barriers.

- Closing coverage and adequacy gaps requires universal and robust social protection systems.
- ► The ILO's Flagship Programme unites global partners to drive solutions and expand coverage.








# Flagship Programme approach: first two phases (2016 – 2025)



# "Partnerships forged and strengthened in 2024 will further multiply results and impacts achieved by the Programme ..."



- ▶ Multi-donor programme continues to offer advantages of greater alignment and efficiency of operations, while preserving flexibility in fund management.
- New or expanded partnerships with the European Union, Switzerland and the United Kingdom.
- ▶ Renewal of ILO-IMF partnership in second phase with focus on social protection financing.
- Continued engagement with private sector on priorities of social health protection.







# "To date, the ILO has raised over US\$120 million for Flagship Programme activities worldwide ..."

- ► For its Second Phase, the Flagship Programme has mobilized US\$122.1 million + US\$10 million in ILO resources.
- ▶ Includes US\$8.1 million mobilized in 2024.
- More coherent resource mobilization approach: multi-donor programme.
- Strengthen in-country support and close funding gap of US\$27.9 million.
- ► Further develop and strengthen thematic work.

# "Laying the groundwork is critical before scaling and accelerating impact ..."







**UN Global Accelerator** 

- Builds strong foundations of national social protection systems essential for the success of initiatives like the Global Accelerator.
- ▶ Devises strategies to extend social protection to the informal economy. Links social protection to climate change.
- Works on social protection financing gaps and fiscal space analysis. Supports SP financial and administrative governance.

► ILO flagship programme. Develops partnerships on social protection (e.g. USP2030).

- Complements the FP, by trying to overcome social protection coverage and financing gaps through integrated policy and financing.
- Develops integrated policy approaches (employment, skills, social protection, SME, fiscal) leading to greater social protection coverage and adequacy in the informal economy.
- Promotes social protection for just and sustainable transitions in the context of climate change, digitalization, demographic shifts and sectoral transformations.
- Engages with Ministries of Finance, IFIs and DFIs, global gateway to increase investments in social protection and the social impact of infrastructure projects.
- UN high impact initiative with high level commitments from governments. Partnerships beyond the social protection community.

Preparation for the third (3<sup>rd</sup>) phase of the Global Flagship Programme (2026-2030)

#### Development of a new phase of the Programme's Strategy

- Drawing upon lessons learned from implementation and evaluations.
- Articulating links with initiatives such as Global Accelerator, Global Shield against Climate Risks, Loss and Damage Fund, UN Peace and Development Fund, Rapid Social Response Adaptive and Dynamic Social Protection Umbrella Trust Fund (RSR ADSP), etc.
- ► A resource mobilization strategy, including more diverse partners.
- Revised monitoring and evaluation framework.
